## CASA Dean's MMU (Monday Morning Update)

Dear Colleagues,

Commencement is one of our favorite times of an academic year! It is always exciting to celebrate new graduates embarking on the next phase of life. It represents the culmination of extraordinary commitment and effort by our students and, at the same time, the dedicated faculty and staff, as well as the support of family and loved ones. It is incredibly affirming to see the graduates and their families and friends celebrating the outcome of their efforts. On Saturday, May 14, 2016, the College of Applied Sciences and Arts graduated 376 students, which is 19.35% of the overall SIUC undergraduate students who were receiving their diplomas that day. Among these 376 graduates, 345 received bachelor's degrees, 14 received master's degrees, and 17 received associate degrees. CASA is not only graduating students in quantity, but also with top quality. During the 140th Annual Commencement, more than 103 students wore special medallions and honor cords reflecting significant academic achievements earned. Among the 103 students earning recognition, 64 received Cum Laude distinction, signifying a cumulative GPA of 3.5 to 3.749; 28 received Magna Cum Laude distinction, signifying a cumulative GPA of 3.75 to 3.899, and 11 students received Summa Cum Laude distinction, carrying a cumulative GPA of 3.9 to 4.0. There were also several students in the University Honors Program who maintained an average GPA of 3.3 or better, and more than 35 students with multiple degrees. Many of last weekend's graduates probably have read the recent news that members of the Class of 2016 are entering the best job market since the recession. We wish them successful careers and bright futures!

Joan Higginbotham, a 1987 SIU Carbondale graduate and former astronaut, was the commencement speaker and she shared many insights to encourage and inspire our graduates to capture the amazing opportunities life will bring them and to never give up when faced with obstacles. As Joan shared: "All my life I was told the sky is the limit, but I disagree. I'm here to tell you the sky is no longer the limit and I know because I have literally been above and beyond." Joan's talk was positive, encouraging and inspirational, and I think it was one of the best commencement speeches in the past few years.

John Dobbins, Michael Behrmann, Faith Miller, and Jennifer Sherry were faculty marshals, and Austin H. Mulcahy, Automotive Technology (AUT) program graduate, was CASA's Gonfalon Carrier. Jared Stern, Undergraduate Student Government president and Aviation Management junior, was honorary student marshal and carried the University Charter and the inspirational message that was written by the late Charles D. Tenney, SIU professor and Distinguished Service Award recipient. The message is displayed on the south wall of Morris Library's Hall of Presidents and Chancellors.

#### FINAL GRADING

Official grade submission is done online using Self-Service Banner (SSB) after logging into <u>SalukiNet</u>. The primary instructor for a course is responsible for the final grade submission. Please note that grades are due by 8:00am on Tuesday, May 17, 2016. Tomorrow morning, Elaine Atwood (Chief Academic Advisor) will receive a fax with the list of CASA courses that have NRs (Not Reported). Those instructors will have an additional day to enter grades. On Wednesday at 8:00am, the system locks and rolls. Then each student's academic standing is calculated. Once that happens, a grade change card is required to enter or change a grade. Please make sure you submit your final grade in time.




