Among others, Mike Burgener (Chair of Aviation Technologies and Aviation Management and Flight), John Voges (Chief Flight Instructor), Jacob Schwarz (Head Coach of Flying Salukis), and Harry Fanning (Instructor of Aviation Technologies) attended this event. 
