


















Employee morale is extremely important to the success of this College. The SIU Day event, and the Faculty Welcome Back Luncheon on September 26, 2018, have greatly improved the morale of faculty and staff by providing a positive energy to the University. It is our common goal to increase our enrollment, retention and graduation rate. The SIU Day and Faculty Luncheon events created synergy among faculty and staff towards our collective goal.

CASA RETENTION INITIATIVE PROGRESS

Today is the beginning of the 8th week of the semester. I would like to take this opportunity to remind you of the "A" (Access) stage of the CASA "NEAT" Initiative starting today. During the next two weeks, students will take their mid-term tests, and faculty should grade and post test grades timely so that our students will be able to Access their official mid-term grade report in SalukeNet.

Most CASA programs now have Faculty Mentors for the first year students. Faculty mentors are expected to meet with the mentees several times per semester, addressing questions related to student success, including academic performance, career path, research opportunities, and professional development. On behalf of the College, I would like express my sincere appreciation to these faculty mentors.

Up to this point, CASA has hired six **Academic Associates** (**AA**) - Note previously we called them APA (Academic Peer Associates) but we have now dropped the word "Peer" to avoid potential confusion with those "Academic Peer Advocates" hired by the SIU Housing Department who work in the dining halls. Our AAs are juniors or seniors who are willing to interact with fellow students in the same major to discover academic and non-academic student concerns from students, and to report those concerns timely to the Dean's Office. They will work under the supervision of the Dean's Office staff, and they act as liaisons between students and administration. In the past week and this week, our AAs are collecting commonly asked questions from new students and suggesting answers. Our short-term goal is to develop a virtual agent that can answer student commonly or frequently asked questions (FAQs) 24/7 anywhere on or off-campus.

Last week all academic advisors and department chairs / school directors received a list of students who were identified as "at-risk" students through our early warning system. In the interest of helping these students that are struggling in the middle of the semester, I would like to ask each of you for your assistance. If you find any students that you feel are at risk or are failing in your class, please contact the academic advisor or department chair / school director and let them know these students' names and contact information. The "Shared Note" function of the Student Success Collaborative (SSC) allows us to add a note to a student's file so that all of us can offer help to this student collaboratively. Thank you for your cooperation.

CASA TEACHER OF THE YEAR

Every year the College gives awards to outstanding faculty in two categories: T/TT Teacher of the Year, and NTT Teacher of the Year. Please nominate a CASA Teacher of the Year by **November 15, 2018**. All winners will be recognized at the CASA Winter Potluck – Thursday, December 13, 2018. The nomination packet should consist of only the nominee's CV, ICE scores, and a letter of recommendation from the Chair/Director.

If the <u>tenured</u> winner of the College award wants to be nominated for the University-level award, they will need to provide all of the dossier items required for the University award as follows:

- A statement of philosophy, teaching goals, and objectives. Provide some examples of the goals and results in specific classes as illustrations. This statement should not exceed 500 words.
- Teaching assignment for the last three years. Please include information on class sizes, whether courses were undergraduate or graduate, team-taught, and/or assisted by a graduate assistant.
- Other undergraduate teaching-related activities: advising, mentoring, organization of help sessions, etc.
- Evaluation of teaching by undergraduate students, faculty colleagues (peer reviews), Director and the Dean. Please provide numerical summaries of evaluation forms and a sample of written comments rather than entire sets of ICE or department teaching evaluation forms. Evaluative letters of undergraduate teaching ability are encouraged, but with a maximum of 5-7 letters for each category (former students, SIUC colleagues, colleagues at other universities, and other sources).
- Further supporting evidence in the form of journal articles, books, grants, etc., related to undergraduate teaching should also be included. Also, note any previous teaching awards and the basis for those awards received either at a university or from regional or national organizations.
- The current curriculum vitae.

• Dr. Qian (Jenny) Huang, Assistant Professor of Architecture, and Dr.Rolando Gonzalez-Torres, Associate Professor of Architecture, have been awarded \$75,000 for their OSHA training proposal submitted to the US Department of Labors.

This federal grant is funded by the US Department of Labor, whose occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) selects and awards grants to nonprofit organizations on a highly competitive basis. Grants are awarded to provide training and education programs for employers and workers on the recognition, avoidance, and prevention of safety and health hazards in their workplaces and to inform workers of their rights and employers of their responsibilities under the Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) Act. The FY 18 grant receipts include SIUC, Purdue University, University of Georgia, etc.

This project proposes to develop electrical hazards and controls training materials for employers and workers in the construction industry. Training topics will include common electrical hazards, and preventing electrical injuries and fatalities at construction job sites. The focus audience is

small and new businesses, low-literacy, young, hard-to-reach, and limited English proficiency construction workers. Training materials will include a course matrix, PowerPoint presentation, instructor and student manuals, handouts, sign-in sheets, pre- and post-tests and evaluations. Downloadable materials will be available in English, Spanish, and Mandarin.

ILLINOIS PUBLIC UNIVERSITY ENROLLMENT

According to IBHE Data Points (https://tinyurl.com/y7ra9dpx), overall fall enrollment in 2018-19 at Illinois public universities (including both undergraduate and graduate programs) declined -1% (-2,301 FTE) from academic year 2017-18 and -5% (-8,878 FTE) from academic year 2015-16. Southern Illinois University Carbondale (-13%), Western Illinois University (-11%), and Northeastern Illinois University (-10%) all experienced enrollment declines of 10% or greater relative to 2017-18. Eastern Illinois University (+10%), the University of Illinois at Chicago (+4%), and the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (+2%) experienced an overall increase in fall enrollment relative to 2017-18.
